What is a Bee House?

A bee house is a structure, often similar in appearance to a birdhouse, but filled with native bee nesting materials such as hollowed stems and cardboard tubes. When designed properly, they can provide safe nesting spots for some native solitary bees like mason bees and leafcutter bees.

What is the Contest?

We have bee houses to give away to those in Waterloo Region who can demonstrate that they have the desire to care for them and work to promote pollinators.

How to Win:

The contest is simple: Send us a photo or video of where you would put the pollinator house in your backyard/property/neighbourhood/schoolyard, along with a short description about why it would be beneficial there.

- *** Contestant must in Waterloo Region to be eligible due to delivery restrictions
- *** One entry per household or school
